Facilities

The North Cedar staff and Board of Directors work undoubtedly hard to maintain facilities and to make financial decisions in a way to balance routine and preventive maintenance care while updating other spaces that reflect the purple pride we have at North Cedar Community School District.

With aging buildings and grounds, there are needs on roof repairs, tuck-pointing, heating/AC repairs, and sidewalks. Many of these projects were done over the summer. We will be finishing our Clarence building with a major HVAC project this fall.

Our bus fleet is well maintained and has been updated the last two years to effectively handle our riders. We will continue with our town bus stops which are greatly appreciated by our parents and students. Later this fall, we will have optional key cards or fobs for our younger students to ensure location drop offs and parent communication.

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Message from Principal Carlson

School is back in session, and many great things are happening at North Cedar Jr./Sr. High School! Classes are in session, fall activities are in full swing, and it feels great to have students and staff back in the building! This message will highlight some of the back to school information.

Academics

Students are now in their classes for the fall semester. All of the scheduling adjustments have been finalized. Some changes have been made this year regarding our school day. We have aligned our 7-8th grade schedules with the 9-12th grade schedules. We have also changed the grading system for 7th and 8th graders to be the same as the 9-12th graders (A, B, C, F letter grades will be issued this year). We felt that more uniform policies for our middle school students will help them understand the expectations better when they reach high school. We will continue to use Standards Based Grading throughout the building this year and hope to offer some information to parents who have questions regarding this during PT conferences this fall.

Activities

Volleyball, Football, XC, and Cheerleading are all underway. The volleyball team is off to a great start with a 6-4 record and multiple wins over schools in larger classes than we compete in during the postseason. The football team also started the year off with a 38-6 victory to start 1-0 for the first time in quite a few years. They currently sit at 1-1. The XC team finished 14th at a large meet in Iowa City this week and had some good times that were run. The Cheerleading team has good numbers again this year and has been busy on Friday nights cheering on the football team, and have been actively preparing for our first pep rally at school, coming up this week.


Professional Development

Message from Principal Horman

We were excited to welcome students and families back into the school for our "Unpack Your Backpack Night." This was held on Monday, August 21st, from 5pm-6pm, in both Lowden and Mechanicsville buildings. A big "Thank You" to the Elementary Boosters for providing ice cream sundaes to our students and their families.

PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports. PBIS is a proactive approach to establishing behavior supports and social culture. It is needed for all students to achieve social, emotional, and academic success. At North Cedar Elementary, we



focus on these three ideas: "Respect Yourself, Respect Others, and Respect Property." Expectations are taught to all students and common language is used by the staff to remind students of these expectations.

Students, or entire classes, are acknowledged for following these expectations with tickets of different colors depending on the area or situation.

- Purple Tickets Purple tickets are given to entire classes that display behaviors of respecting self, respecting others, or respecting property. These are highly coveted and when a class earns a certain number, they get to choose a whole class reward such as a PJ party or movie.
- White Tickets White tickets are given to students in common areas (cafeteria, lines, hallway, restroom) or in their classroom for displaying behaviors of respecting themselves, others, or property. These tickets are counted at the end of each month and can be used to buy things from our PBIS store.
- Pink Tickets Pink tickets are handed out during recess time from the recess teachers and helpers. They are also handed out by substitute teachers. These tickets are special because they are counted as double tickets. The tickets can be saved up during the month. Students can use them to buy things from our PBIS store.

The PBIS process is an ongoing system that we will continue to refine over time to best fit the needs of our staff and students.

August Board Meeting Highlights
