The North Cedar Board of Directors needed to submit their focus on two to four of the twenty-two 2023 legislative resolutions that would have the most positive impact on our local schools. The North Cedar Board of Directors formulated the platform during our regular meeting in July of 2023. With the upcoming session starting in January, I wanted to share our priorities with the staff and community. The state priorities will be voted on in November at the IASB Convention and then be advocated for during the 2024 legislative session.

#### DROPOUT/AT RISK

School boards strive to provide every student with the services they need to remain in school, progress, and graduate to become productive citizens. We support state policies to:

- Include dropout prevention and funding for at-risk students in the formation formula and the socio-economic status as a factor in determining a student's at-risk status.
- Equalize the ability of all districts to generate dropout prevention funds.

#### MENTAL HEALTH

Student mental health issues are increasing and impacting student achievement. To address these concerns, we support state policies that would establish comprehensive school and community mental health systems to offer preventative and treatment services to:

- Increase access to in-school and telehealth services.
- Increase access to mental health professionals via in-person or telehealth visits.
- Improve awareness and understanding of child emotional and mental health needs through ongoing teacher, administrator, and support staff training.
- Integrate suicide prevention and coping skills into existing curriculum.
- Support the mental health needs of educators and staff.
- Provide a comprehensive mental health resources clearinghouse for schools and community providers.
- Expand training that includes a referral plan for continuing action provided by mental health professionals outside of the school district.

#### Message from Principal Carlson

This report will highlight some of the current things occurring in the building. As we enter into the month of October, we now are over a month into the school year. October 10th and 12th are parent-teacher conferences at the building. It is a great time for parents to connect with their teachers and see how things are going for their children at school. Parents will be emailed a link to sign up for conferences using PT Connect. Please contact the office if you have any difficulties signing up.

#### **Academics**

We completed MAP tests at the end of September and are currently finishing up make-up tests for students who were not in the building. Believe it or not, quarter 1 ends October 27th and quarter grades will be sent home at that time. This will be the first official report of student grades that all parents and students will receive. This is also a great time to discuss with students the current state of grades they are receiving at the building. As a reminder, all students 7-12 will be receiving a letter of A, B, C or F on their quarter grades. This year, middle school grades have been changed to align with the high school.

#### **Activities**

The fall sports are nearing the end of the season. Some activities will begin postseason play this month. We host the TRC volleyball tournament finals at home this year on Saturday, October 14th. Our last home contests for multiple sports will be played in the month of October, so come out and support the Knights!

#### **Professional Development**

With the change in scheduling due to the student count day being October 2nd, we will have Professional Development on October 16th and 30th. Our staff will continue with the work we did last year with our teacher leadership teams. This year's groups will consist of PBIS, Academic, and Culture as the three main teacher leadership groups. We are also trying to personalize PD this year to meet the needs of each individual teacher in regards to their professional development. The three different main categories that teachers will break into are: Content Area/Instructional Practices, Behavior, and Skills for Learning/ Relationships. There will be subcategories breaking off from these main categories, but teachers will be given some choice regarding the path that they feel they need to continue to work on for professional development.

- Designate a categorical funding stream for mental health professionals serving students and ongoing teacher, administrator, and support staff mental health training.
- Support development of a mental health workforce to provide services to children.

#### TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND RETENTION

- Developing effective teachers and keeping them in every lowa school district is crucial to student success and can be supported through state policies that:
- Provide teacher leadership and quality professional development programs.
- Provide beginning teacher mentoring programs.
- Use the management fund to offer retention incentives to maintain a highquality teacher workforce.
- Allow flexibility and resources to pay school staff market competitive wages.
- Provide resources to school districts for ongoing cultural competency training.



#### SUPPLEMENTAL STATE AID

The school aid formula is the biggest driver in providing resources for a high-quality education that translates to a successful future for our students and economic growth in our state. A school's general fund supports a high-quality teacher workforce, critical for student achievement. We support state policies on supplemental state aid rate that:

- Sufficiently supports the ability of local districts to meet parent and community expectations and provide a
  world-class education for all students.
- Provide the resources to recruit and retain a high-quality teacher and staff workforce.
- Incorporate inflation and cost-of-living increases to minimize the negative impact on a district's general fund from these increased costs.

Remember, all twenty-two legislative resolutions would have a positive impact on North Cedar Schools, but these four the Board felt would focus on our current work and vision. Please be supportive and share these with your representatives in the state legislature.

#### **September Board Meeting Highlights**

Each month the North Cedar School Board shares a few highlights of our monthly board meetings. These takeaways are messages that the board collectively feels are important for the public to know. Here are the highlights from the September 18, 2023 regular meeting:

- Thank you to the Choir & Ms. Broring. Chamber choir members sang the National Anthem at the school board meeting. They did a great job! Thank you to Ms. Broring for all the work you do.
- Lowden Daycare Building. The board has agreed to purchase the daycare building in Lowden. This building is being purchased with SAVE funds and won't affect the general budget.
- Calendar Change. Due to state regulation and count day, the calendar had to be amended. Monday, October 2 will now be a full day with students. Monday, October 30 will be a full PD day without students. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause.
