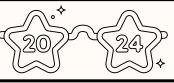

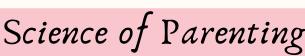

Positive Discipline: Parents often cite guidance and discipline as their number one concern. This workshop will help you see positive discipline as an opportunity to build positive parent-child relationships.

Understanding Research and Reality: How do parents use research to help inform their unique parenting reality? Learn about how parenting realities are different and discover helpful parenting tools and techniques

Children's Ages and Parenting Stages: As kids grow through different ages, parents also go through stages! Learn about those stages, development, and tips for adapting your parenting to your child's age and abilities.

Understanding Temperament: Every child is unique, and individual temperament is one of the biggest reasons why! This workshop will introduce the individual temperament traits and explore how your child's temperament can impact their feelings and behaviors.





Provides coaching and consultation of research-based, behavioral intervention strategies rooted in Early Childhood Positive Behavior Supports (EC-PBIS) to childcare providers to support children ages 0-5 experiencing intense behavioral challenges. Children may be referred by childcare providers or families, as this support can be a big help to families who may be in danger of losing their employment if their child is unable to remain in their childcare setting.
