On behalf of the North Cedar Community School District, I want to sincerely thank you for your overwhelming support of the General Obligation (GO) Bond and SAVE (Secure an Advanced Vision for Education) Extension.

On November 4, voters authorized improvements at Lowden Elementary and the North Cedar Jr./Sr. High School, including a new two-story addition at Lowden and a multipurpose activities space at the high school to support both fine arts and athletics.

Your approval reflects a deep belief in the value of education and a shared commitment to the future of our students. By passing these measures, our community has ensured that North Cedar students will have modern, high-quality learning environments and equitable opportunities, all without increasing property taxes.

These projects are the result of careful planning, guided by a community-led facilities committee and a full assessment of our schools. 












Elementary News!

The eight principles are: Keep it dry, clean, safe, well-versilated, pest-free, contaminant free, well maintained and thermally controlled.
